Proposed Budget Approval - Summary

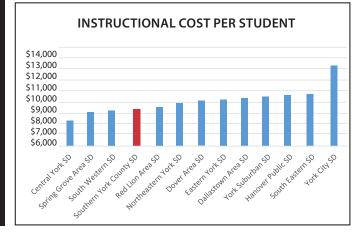
The Southern York County School District Board of Education approved a proposed \$57.2 million budget for the 2018-19 fiscal year. The proposed budget includes an assumption of no increased state funding, \$1.5 million use of fund balance, and a 2.48% real estate tax increase.

The proposed budget, approved by the Board of Education on April 19, 2018, is based upon the priorities of providing an excellent educational program to prepare our students for the 21st century while maintaining our outstanding facilities at a level our community supports. To meet these priorities, the budget includes restoration of several teaching positions, required funding for charter school and other placements, curriculum additions, and a phase-in of debt service for building renovations.

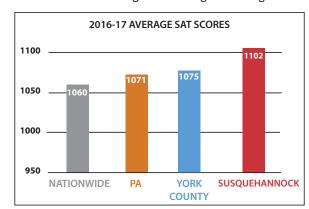
Superintendent Dr. Sandra Lemmon stated, "The Board and administration are pleased to present a budget that we believe provides the resources to prepare our students for the ever-changing world, while maintaining a culture of fiscal responsibility."

Fiscal Responsibility - Return on Investment

A primary responsibility of the School Board and Administration is to ensure that public funds are spent in a responsible and cost-effective manner. We have an impressive rate of return, especially considering our low tax rate and high student achievement, in comparison to other York County school districts. We pay careful attention to the proper use of all resources and implementation of the highest accounting and reporting standards.



Susquehannock students performed well beyond the national, state, and York County averages on the SAT even though the most recent instructional cost per student is one of the lowest in the County. These scores are a good indicator of overall student achievement from kindergarten through twelfth grade.



2018-19 Budget-at-a Glance

Funding of public education continues to be the most volatile issue in Pennsylvania politics. State and federal revenues fund less than one-third of the cost of education, requiring the majority of the cost to be funded at the local level. To balance the budget, it will be necessary to increase our real estate tax rate next year. Nevertheless, compared to other York County school districts in the Lincoln Intermediate Unit, our real estate tax rate is the lowest. Our extensive process to prioritize needs continues to be an effective way to control our expenditures. This approach requires annual review of every budgeted expenditure.

There has been much discussion in recent years about prop-

erty tax reform and the role of real estate taxes. It is important to note that school real estate taxes assessed in Southern York County School District go directly to the District to fund the education of the community's students.

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Revenues

As noted, the majority of the revenue is from local sources, specifically real estate taxes. Growth in the real estate tax base is estimated at 0.70%. There is also expected growth of approximately 2% in earned income tax revenue. In addition, we have budgeted increases for realty transfer taxes and earnings on temporary investments. All other local revenue is basically unchanged for 2018-19.

The proposed budget includes a tax increase of 2.48%, which is below the allowable index of 2.9%. The tax rate has not been approved at this time. The tax rate is expected to be set at the May school board meeting. The Board passed a resolution that taxes cannot go above the index of 2.9%. The Board and administration seriously consider the impact an increase in taxes has on its community members. While many districts adhere to a policy of raising taxes to the allowable index each year, that is not the policy at Southern. While there are still many unfunded needs, it is understood that the tax burden must be factored into the decision.

Expenditures

The 2018-19 budgeted expenditures are \$1,902,967 or 3.44% higher than 2017-18. The majority of the increase is comprised of restoration of several professional and support staff positions, state-mandated retirement rate increases, and significant increases in other purchased services.

The budget priorities include:

- 1. Continue to build an outstanding educational program
- 2. Maintain overall teacher to student ratio
- 3. Maintain all educational programs, including co-curricular and extra-curricular activities

- 4. Continue to offer Advanced Placement educational programs for secondary students
- 5. Infuse technology into the educational program
- 6. Maintain outstanding physical plant and meet new safety code requirements
- 7. Restore staff and supplies/equipment where most needed
- 8. Continuous review and update of safety measures

Based upon the budget priorities, changes were made to the budget including, restoring two professional staff positions, a paraprofessional position, and a minimal portion of summer maintenance and custodial staff. With the addition of the two teaching positions, there will be 225 professional positions for 2018-19 compared to 248 in 2009-10. There are 23 less teachers than in 2009-10 even though enrollment district-wide is only lower by 41 students.

Other budget additions include a Digital Academy professional staff position, additional supplemental hours for Digital Academy teachers, and a contracted school resource officer. Enrollment in our Digital Academy has exceeded 50 students and to date we have not hired staff for the program. To grow the program and encourage families to utilize our internal program instead of an outside charter option, we felt it was imperative that we now hire staff for the program.
